The increasingly popular iPhone gains most of its popularity from the many applications it has to offer. iPhone users can easily follow their favorite sports teams, search the yellow pages, get driving directions, check banking accounts, play games, or do numerous other things in the palm of their hand. There are also several applications in which the user has immediate access to scripture. Developers of the "Bible Promises" application for iPhone recently released a new version which allows users to "favorite" their most inspiring Bible verses. After analyzing information from thousands of church-goers across the world, five different passages were found to be the most popular.

- Isaiah 40:31 - *"But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not faint."*
- Deuteronomy 31:6 - *"Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you."*
- Psalm 103:2-3 - *"Praise the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits - who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases."*
- Galatians 6:9 - *"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."*
- Philippians 4:6 - *"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."*

My point in sharing this information is not to encourage you to go buy an iPhone so that you can use your cell phone during worship.
