Give an account

"Logos" is the term used in the verse, "the word became flesh and dwelt among us." The word is often used to describe the spoken or written word. The term also has another alternative meaning. It comes from the accounting world and has to do with keeping records. Here the word means a record of assets and liabilities - 'account, credit, debit' (LN.57.228). When it is used in this context it carries the meaning of the computation or reckoning of an account

(BAGD.600).

In Matthew, Jesus uses this word to describe a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants (18:23). It is used in the parable of the talents to describe the masters' return and his desire to settle accounts with them (25:19). In Luke, a rich man fired his manager because of his dishonesty. "Give an account of your management, because you cannot be manager any longer" (16:2).

The meaning that is used in the parables, is also used of you and me. Paul tells the Romans that "each of us will give an account of himself to God" (14:12). The leaders of the local church are men who will have to give an account for those they are to keep watch over (Heb. 13:17). Peter reminds his readers that "they (pagans) will have to give an account to him who is ready to judge the living and the dead" (4:5).

There will come a day reckoning and accounting. We each will be called to give an accounting of our life and how we have lived it. Live your life today so you will be prepared for the accounting test tomorrow.
